Hoping you are very fine, we would appreciate if you could give some attention to the following issue and respond to us on the eventual follow up that can be given to it.

During the last session of the CSF in March, it was mentioned that the yearly budget of the Commission for this Forum is 100.000 euro. The cost of organising a meeting of the CSF in its present form is 50.000 euros, so two meetings per year can be organised.

However, on the March meeting the Commission announced that the budget for 2009 was already dried out (after one meeting), and that therefore the next session would be held in the start of 2010. This announcement has generated quite some doubts among the participants.

Can the Commission explain in detail the budgetary situation for 2009, and when we can expect the next Civil Society Forum to take place?
